SCHOOLS YORKSHIRE CYCLE TOUR

Some of our Year 6 children participated in the Schools Yorkshire Cycling Tour; a prominent cycling event for schools in Yorkshire. It was developed to encourage more young people to take up cycling, by promoting cycling as both as an enjoyable leisure activity as well as a fun and sustainable form of transport. Paradise Primary school was amongst one of 160 schools across Yorkshire who participated in the Schools' Yorkshire cycling challenge which coincided with the celebration of national Bike Week. A baton travelled 400 miles from school to school across the Yorkshire region starting from York and finishing in Doncaster 2 weeks later.

For each section of the relay the baton was passed on by children on bikes to few pupils from a local school, who then cycled on to another school. On 19th of June, pupils and staff at Paradise embraced the event by setting up banners, bunting, balloons & delicious treats to welcome the cyclists from Headfield C of E Junior School who brought the baton to our school. Once this was passed on, some of our Year 6 children got their gear on and were cheered on by pupils and staff as they made their way to Orchard Primary with guidance from Street Bikes and WY Police who directed them on the road-sections. Once they reached Orchard Primary, they were all awarded medals in a short ceremony after which they returned back to school. The participating children thoroughly enjoyed the experience and the whole school got into the spirit of hosting and cheering the cyclists. Well done to our cyclists! Great Effort!!



Junior Apprentice The children thoroughly enjoyed the Junior Apprentice project, especially the year 6 who enthusiastically worked together to plan, formulate and bake scrumptious goodies! The children prepared for the apprenticeship by creating their own team names and interesting product names and competed against one another to see who would sell the most amount of baked goods. The children undertook a series of challenges which tested their creative and entrepreneurial skills. They were required to conduct market research, oversee a marketing campaign to promote their bakes and learnt how to price goods and understand data methods to gain revenue. The eager teams competed with great dedication, demonstrating excellent teamwork skills. They baked a variety of goodies and came up with many exciting and unique ideas to promote their delightful and appealing cakes and bakes! Their final products were amazing! Well done to all the Year 6's for their amazing team work and efforts and raising a whopping £442.53. The winning team Treatology, will choose a charity for a percentage of the proceeds to be donated to. The remainder will be used to buy resources for the school.


