### CROSS CURRICULAR DAY - ORIENTEERING

This terms Cross curricular day was filled with challenging outdoor adventure. Year 3-6 children travelled to Crow Nest Park and had a lot of fun traversing



the parks terrain to undertake an Orienteering challenge. Thanks to East Pennine Orienteering Club, a Permanent Orienteering Course has been developed in Crow Nest Park where children had to use map reading skills to navigate around a course of markers or control points in sequence. Every group was given a unique orienteering map with symbols, and they had to determine the best route to take to search for each symbol/control marked on the map. Not all the control plaques were obvious, so children had to keep an eye out and find as many as possible! The controls were



red and white plastic or meta۱ markers with a letter and number on each of them. Once found. the children had to write the number on the table provided. The challenge was the visit controls on the

Gulliver's Valley Theme Park. They enjoyed the








Reception children demonstrated exceptional creativity by producing outstanding observational drawings of daffodils.






They enjoyed learning about the parts of a flower and labelling them.

Reception children have been learning about The Great Fire of London and have been fascinated with the events. created fire pictures using different media, drew maps of London, created mini books and drew houses from that







ning race. A big Jzk to all parents the who came along to cheer their children on.










For the end of year behaviour treat, children from Years 1—6 enjoyed a fun treat at kick off where they participated
