## Sports Hall Athletics



## YEAR 6



They then looked at templates of shapes which would be stitched on or stuck onto their slipper as decoration. They decided which of the several types of decorations they could make and decorated their slippers, in accordance with their design plan. Some of the different types of decoration techniques that were discussed included Felt, sequins, glitter, glue, stencils, felt tips, wool etc. They finished off by writing an evaluation on the effectiveness of their slippers.



## YEAR 5


During DT, Yr5 pupils learnt various different stitching techniques. The children worked exceptionally hard to master a;

### NURSERY & RECEPTION



Early Years children had been awaiting anxiously for a few days and were watching over the fertilised eggs in the incubator with great anticipation. Finally to their excitement and delight, the chicks arrived! They were fascinated and eggcited to see the whole hatching process and enjoyed watching the chicks grow!



Reception children learnt about the life cycle of a hen and looked at animals that lay eggs. They enjoyed creating their own sliding eggs with the oviparous animal of their choice.



Reception children demonstrated exceptional creativity by producing outstanding observational drawings of daffodils. They enjoyed learning about the parts of a flower and labelling them.



Nursery children have been learning about the journey of letters/packages which are posted and the journey they take as they travel to their destination. Children watched clips and discussed how mail is sorted and delivered. They then wrote letters and messages to their peers and were so excited to receive these messages from each other. They also wrote messages and drew pictures for the important people in their lives. Letter-writing proved so popular amongst the class that a trip was arranged to the local Post office so that children could post the letters. They awaited eagerly at home for the letters to arrive through the letter box and give their loved ones a surprise!





Reception children visited the local scrap metal dealers whilst they were learning about different materials around them. They enjoyed looking at the different materials and different modes of transport. Safety issues were discussed including how to keep safe and how some material can be dangerous as it may be sharp.





### Zikr Tent

Reception children have been learning about the importance of praying (salah, zikr) and supplications. To practically demonstrate how in Ramadhan good deeds, prayers and supplications are increased, a zikr tent was set up for children in the classroom. They enjoyed performing salah, doing zikr and making dua in the tent. They prayed for good health, made dua for their parents and the less fortunate. Whilst talking about the importance of supplication, the children enjoyed sharing their views of what they would like to make dua for.



### The Great Fire Of London

Reception children have been learning about The Great Fire of London and have been fascinated with the events. They created fire pictures using different media, drew maps of London, created mini books and drew houses from that time. The talked about how there was no fire service and then compared fire engines from today to those in the past. We talked about how Samuel Pepys wrote about the fire in his diary and we made portraits looking at his images. The children particularly enjoyed the quiz where statements were given and children had to decide if they were true or false. The children remembered the main events very well!
