Queens Platinum Jubilee






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National Storytelling Week

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World Maths Day


Children carried out a range of Maths activities for World Maths Day to help improve accuracy and confidence in arithmetic and problem-solving.







who created excellent posters on energy conservation and outlining ways to help save energy.




The School Games Athletics event was great fun for our KS1 pupils. They had a great afternoon and really enjoyed participating in all the different games. Super effort!




NURSERY
